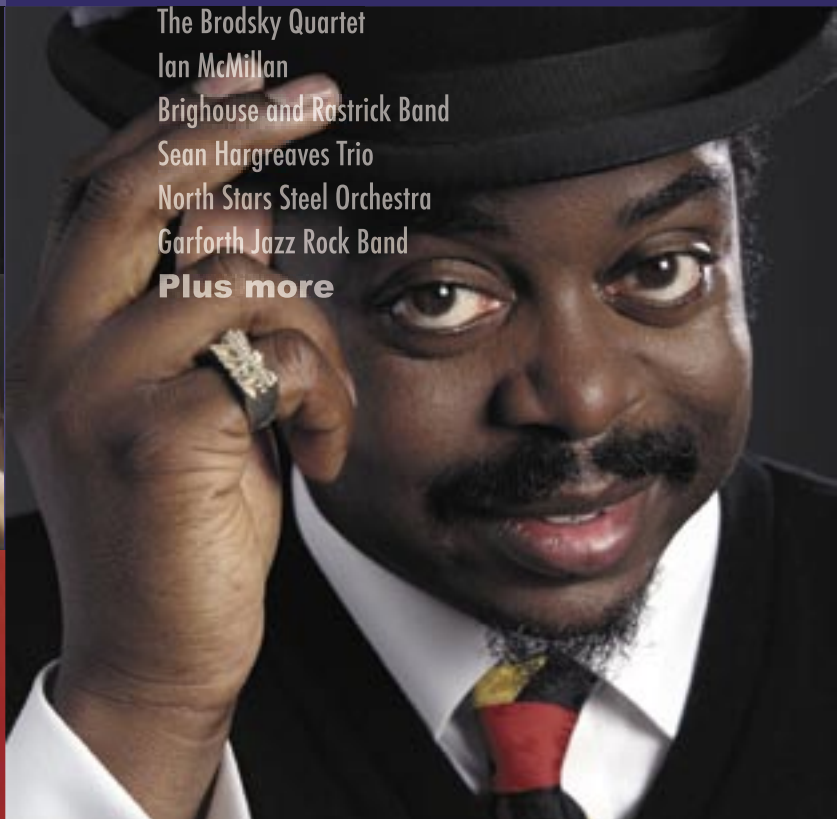

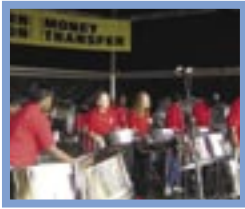

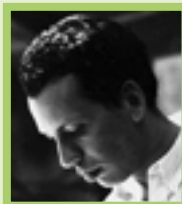

Helen Reid first came to public attention when she appeared on BBC2 in the National Keyboard Finals of the BBC Young Musician

competition in 1998. In 2000 she won first prize in the Karic International Piano Competition.

Helen has given recitals all around England, at venues including the Wigmore Hall, Purcell Room, Fairfield Halls and Blackheath Halls, London. Helen's solo repertoire is wide-ranging and includes works from the 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st centuries. In August 2003 she performed at a Pre-Prom portrait of the composer Chen Yi at the V & A, which was broadcast on BBC Radio 3.

Helen is currently professor of piano at the Guildhall School of Music, Trinity College of Music Junior Department and Leeds College of Music.

Twice nominated for the prestigious Nationwide Mercury Prize ('Red Rice' –Topic/1999 and 'Anglicana'/2003) – Eliza is also the winner of an unrivalled seven BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards. In 2003 she became the first traditional English musician to

be nominated a BBC Radio 3 Award for World Music (for Anglicana). Describing herself simply as a 'modern British musician' she has revitalised and made folk music relevant to new audiences with intelligent, charismatic and boundary-crossing performances.

james taylor quartet



James Taylor, Hammond guru, has consistently remained at the forefront of the jazz funk scene since his debut twenty years ago. JTQ's first album in 1987, *Mission Impossible*, laid the foundation for what would become their signature sound: funk-ed-up, sleazed-down, keyboard-driven jazz that could be Webster's entry for "groovy."

Renowned for their film and TV themes, live favourites include JTQ's debut single "Blow Up," the mesmerising "2001," and of course, the inimitable, infamous "Starsky & Hutch."

kate rusby



Kate Rusby has not only become one of the British folk scene's best loved and most revered artists, she's taken the music to startling new territories, seducing audiences who'd normally run a mile from folk music.

Kate was awarded BBC Radio 2 Folk Singer of the Year 2000, Best Original Song in 2002 and Best Live Act in 2006. The album *Sleepless* was awarded BBC Radio 2 Best Folk Album of the year in 2000 and also won a Mercury Music Prize in 1999.
